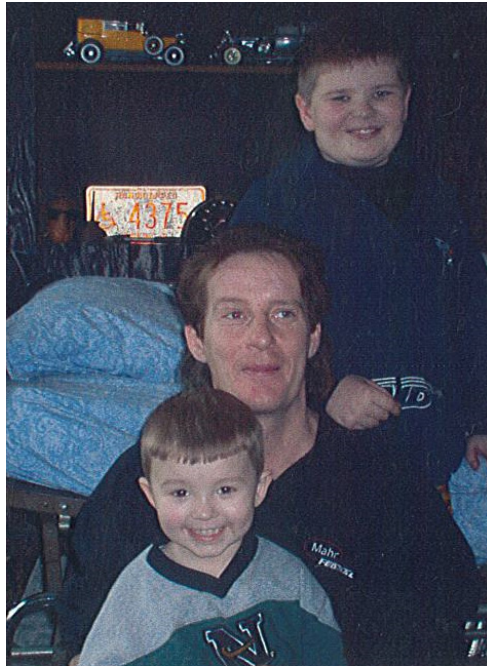
Wayne Strobel
